



WEEKLY UPDATE ON ASEAN PLUS THREE FOOD SECURITY RELATED INFORMATION

Brunei Darussalam

Tutong district of Brunei Darussalam was flooded. According to the Tutong District Office, continuous rains caused the Tutong River to overflow several areas of Benutan, Rambai, Kuala Ungar/Bangkuru, Panchong, and Layong villages of Tutong district. Floods affected more than 700 people, and over 200 houses in the villages of Merimbun, Kuala Ungar, Rambai, Benutan, and Panchong while some roads were impassable. The Fire and Rescue Department monitored the water level in affected areas. Besides, other related agencies worked together to provide assistance to those affected. The residents were warned to stay alert and vigilant.

Indonesia

The death toll from Indonesia's 5.6 - magnitude quake climbed to 323.

According to the National Search and Rescue Agency as of 29 November 2022, there were 323 people killed, 730 injured, 73,693 displaced, and nine people still missing after a 5.6-magnitude earthquake hit Cianjur town of Indonesia's West Java province on 21 November 2022. The joint search and rescue team continued to find those missing. Moreover, the deadly quake damaged 58,049 houses, 368 schools, 144 places of worship, 14 health facilities, and 16 buildings or offices. A total of 16 districts and 146 villages also affected.

Malaysia

Flash floods struck many parts of Klang Valley of Malaysia. Several hours of heavy rainfall caused flash floods in various parts of Klang valley on 29 November 2022. The townships of Kota Warisan and Dengkil in Sepang District, Selangor state were affected while several areas in Putrajaya city were also reported of flooding, and some roads submerged in mud-water. Furthermore, 18 houses in Meru town were affected by floods. However, no one had to evacuate from this incident.

Viet Nam

Central Viet Nam was struck by flooding. On 22 November 2022, many streets in Vinh city of central Nghe An province, Viet Nam were flooded after 15 hours of incessant rains hit the areas. Dinh Cong Trang, Le Ninh, Nguyen Thi Minh Khai, Nguyen Trai,

and Phan Dinh Cang streets were submerged by 30 - 50 centimetres of floodwaters while several vehicles got stuck on the roads. Traffic police forces were stationed at multiple zones to warn people not to enter severely flooded areas, and to help people with damaged vehicles. Later, Viet Nam Disaster Management Authority (VDMA) reported of one person died, and around 270 houses were damaged.
