Malaysia

More people became displaced due to floodings in Malaysia. According to the ASEAN Disaster Information Network (ADINet), southern Malaysia was hit by heavy rainfall causing floods in five states namely Johor, Kelantan, Pahang, Perak, and Terengganu. As of 12 December 2022, 2,550 people had been displaced to 29 evacuation centres while over 9,260 houses were damaged. The number of flood evacuees increased in Johor, Pahang, Perak, and Terengganu on 13 December 2022. There was a warning of thunderstorms and heavy rains in Kuala Kangsar, Manjung, Kinta, Perak Tengah, Kampar, Bagan Datuk, and Hilir Perak.

The Philippines

A moderate earthquake jolted Davao Oriental. On 10 December 2022, a

magnitude 5.6 earthquake rattled Davao Oriental province of the Philippines and its neighboring areas according to the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology. The quake struck 51 kilometres southeast of Governor Generoso municipality of Davao Oriental. Meanwhile, the tremor at Intensity IV (moderately strong) was felt in Governor Generoso, Bansalan municipality in Davao del Sur province, and Malapatan and Malungon municipalities in Sarangani province. People were advised to stay alert of aftershocks.

Viet Nam

Floods claimed the lives of five people in Viet Nam. Heavy downpours triggered floods in the central region of Viet Nam. As of 6 December 2022, five people died while 2,903 houses in Thua Thien Hue province, and over 10 hectares of rice and 620 hectares of crops in Quang Nam province were submerged. Some roads were passable due to landslides. Several houses and properties in the southern province of Vinh Long city were damaged by severe erosion at the riverbank. Local authorities set warning signs to prevent people from entering the danger zone, and evacuated 17 households to safety areas. The localities were required to continue monitor on the weather to take appropriate response measures.
