Indonesia

Widespread downpours in Indonesia left two people dead. East Kalimantan province of Indonesia had been hit by torrential rains since the end of May 2025, causing many rivers to overflow. Samarinda city, Kutai Kartanegara, and Berau regencies were submerged. As of 4 June 2025, two people died and two others were missing. More than 2,500 people were affected, and over 700 houses, and seven schools were damaged.

Philippines

Severe inundation affected the Philippines, including Metro Manila. On 6 June 2025, heavy rainfall caused destructive flooding in San Jose del Monte city, Bulacan province with floodwaters reaching neck-deep levels in some areas. More than 1,300 people were affected, and one person was injured. Infrastructure was also damaged. Flooding was reported near Manila Bay in Metro Manila. The National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management

Council distributed relief items and meals to those affected.

Thailand

Floods forced the closure of schools in Thailand. Maha Sarakham province, Thailand experienced widespread flooding following torrential rain on 11 June 2025. Roads in the province were submerged causing small vehicles to be impassable. Several schools were forced to closed temporarily due to severe weather and power outage.

Viet Nam

Deadly deluges wreaked havoc in Viet Nam. Torrential downpours on 7 – 8 June 2025 triggered severe floods across the northern provinces of Viet Nam. One person was killed in Ha Giang province while another was swept away by flash floods in Lao Cai province. The floods damaged 138 houses, and over 110 hectares of crops. Meanwhile, about 700 livestock and poultry died, and 56 hectares of fish ponds were affected. Authorities warned of downpours, thunderstorms, hail, lightning, and strong winds.

China

A mild earthquake struck China while a typhoon alert was also issued. On 5 June 2025, a 5.0-magnitude earthquake

jolted Eryuan County in Dali Bai Autonomous Prefecture, China's Yunnan province. The quake, at a depth of 10 kilometres, was strongly felt in Eryuan county, Heqing county, and Dali city. Local authorities promptly initiated an emergency response. In addition, the southernmost island province of Hainan issued a Level IV typhoon alert on 10 June 2025 after a tropical depression formed over the central South China Sea and was expected to develop into the first typhoon of 2025.
