Indonesia

Earthquake and flooding hit Indonesia.

On 8 April 2026, a 4.9-magnitude earthquake struck the northern Savu Sea between Pulau Solor and Pulau Lembata in Indonesia. A total of 1,116 people were affected and 332 houses were damaged in Flores Timur Regency, East Nusa Tenggara. Meanwhile, flooding since 10 April 2026 killed one person in Blora Regency, Central Java. A total of 73 people were displaced and 922 houses were affected in Bandung Regency, West Java. In total, 3,503 people were affected, according to the report of 13 April 2026.

Philippines

A series of minor earthquakes were recorded in the Philippines.

On 10 April 2026, a 4.1-magnitude earthquake struck off Pangasinan, the Philippines. The instrument intensity was recorded at Level I (scarcely perceptible) and felt in Bolinao and Bani, Pangasinan. No damage or aftershocks were reported. Another earthquake hit the country on 13 April 2026, measuring 4.0 magnitude, near

Tigbauan in Iloilo. The instrument intensity was recorded at Level I in Jordan, Guimaras, and Iloilo City, while tremors were slightly felt in parts of Iloilo and nearby Guimaras Province.

Thailand

Summer storms were forecast in parts of Thailand.

As of 14 April 2026, summer storms were expected to affect upper Thailand from 16 to 20 April 2026, accompanied by thunderstorms, strong winds, isolated hail, and possible lightning. The Northeast and Eastern of Thailand were expected to be affected first, followed by the Central Plain and the Northern regions. Residents were advised to stay away from open areas, large trees, and unstable structures due to the risk of strong winds and lightning.

Republic of Korea

Severe weather disrupted transport in South Korea.

As of 9 April 2026, torrential rainfall and strong winds affected Jeju, South Korea. A total of 206 flights, including 195 domestic and 11 international flights, were cancelled, while 51 domestic flights were delayed. In Gwangju and Yeosu, flight cancellations and delays were also reported due to severe weather. Furthermore, a high waves advisory was issued for the southern outer sea, the southwestern and southeastern inner seas south of Jeju Island. All passenger ship services between Jeju's main island and Udo, Gapado Island, and Marado Island were suspended.
