



## WEEKLY UPDATE ON ASEAN PLUS THREE RICE SITUATIONS

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### Cambodia

#### ***Cambodia exports 449,325 tonnes of milled rice in the first nine months of 2022.***

According to the Cambodia Rice Federation, the country exported 449,325 tonnes of milled rice, up 10 percent year-on-year, earning nearly 287 million USD from January to September 2022. In the three-quarter period, Cambodia's milled rice export to the European Union (EU) rose by 46 percent, reflecting the demand in the EU. Meanwhile, China purchased 198,107 tonnes during this period, accounting for 44.09 percent of total shipments although it remained stagnant with a little percentage growth.

### Thailand

#### ***Thailand's rice prices inch down while demand is muted.***

Thailand's 5 percent broken rice prices decreased to 415-425 USD per tonne from 422-435 USD per tonne last week. Demand has been muted but flooding overseas could increase demand for Thai rice. Meanwhile, shipments were made mostly to regular customers, while rice supply was ample, Bangkok-based traders said.

### Viet Nam

#### ***Viet Nam rice exports decrease by 18.8 percent month-on-month.***

Customs data showed that Viet Nam's rice exports fell 18.8 percent to 583,203 tonnes in September 2022 compared with the previous month. Meanwhile, the country's rice exports from January to September 2022 rose 17.7 percent to 5.37 million tonnes year-on-year, which was valued at 2.6 billion USD.

#### ***Rates for Vietnamese rice edge up amid tight domestic supplies.***

Prices of Vietnamese 5 percent broken rice rose to 425-430 USD per tonne from 420-425 USD per tonne a week ago. Demand is picking up and the Philippines is expected to import more rice because of the shortfall caused by the recent storms. Meanwhile, domestic supplies are running low as the summer-autumn harvest is ending. Moreover, Vietnamese rice prices could increase further over the coming weeks on tight supplies due to adverse weather in several rice-growing countries and on rising demand, especially in China, traders based in Ho Chi Minh City said.
