



WEEKLY UPDATE ON ASEAN PLUS THREE RICE SITUATIONS

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Cambodia

Cambodia exported 445,913 tonnes of milled rice in the first three quarters of 2024.

According to the Cambodia Rice Federation, Cambodia exported 445,913 tonnes of milled rice from January to September 2024, earning 335 million USD. China remained the top buyer, purchasing 81,423 tonnes and generating gross revenue of 56 million USD. Meanwhile, exporting to the European Union countries with amounting to 228,731 tonnes, earning 186 million USD and ASEAN at 86,043 tonnes, earning revenues of 52 million USD.

Thailand

Thailand's rice prices dropped amid quiet demand.

Prices of Thai 5 percent broken rice slightly fell to 510 USD per tonne, the weakest since June 2023, from 510-515 USD per tonne a week ago. Demand has been quiet because buyers were slowing their purchases after India lifted the export ban. Supply at the end of harvest season is expected to be good this year, Bangkok based traders said.

Viet Nam

Prices of Vietnamese rice edged down in this week.

According to the Vietnam Food Association, Vietnamese 5 percent broken rice prices decreased to 538 USD per tonne, the lowest level since July 2023, from 552 USD per tonne a week earlier. Moreover, the country's rice exports in 2024 would be higher than 7.6 million tonnes. According to the government trader data, shipments in the first nine months of 2024 rose 8.9 percent to 6.99 million tonnes from 2023.
