



## WEEKLY UPDATE ON ASEAN PLUS THREE RICE SITUATIONS

### Cambodia

***Cambodia's rice exports surpasses 1.5 billion USD from the first ten months of 2024.***

According to the Cambodia Rice Federation, Cambodia has earned over 1.5 billion USD from paddy and milled rice from January to October 2024. The country exported 502,029 tonnes of milled rice to 66 foreign countries and territories, earning 376 million USD. 26 countries in the European Union bought 254,945 tonnes of milled rice, worth 196 million USD. Seven countries from ASEAN members imported 100,996 tonnes, helping 66 million USD, while China imported 93,197 tonnes, worth 61 million USD.

### Thailand

***Thai rice prices are in the same range as last week.***

Prices of Thai 5 percent broken rice were quoted at 490 USD per tonne, similar to 485-495 USD per tonne last week, a result of dollar appreciation after the United States of America's election. Demand is stable, just seeing regular customers, Bangkok-based traders.

### Viet Nam

***Viet Nam's rice prices are stable while Bulog will buy 80,000 tonnes.***

Rates for Vietnamese 5 percent broken rice remained at 520-525 USD per tonne. Rice prices are stable amid the dwindling supplies and concerns over an approaching storm that may cause rains. Meanwhile, Bulog will buy over 80,000 tonnes from Viet Nam which is expected to be delivered in November and December 2024, according to the bidding result earlier this week. Furthermore, the government data showed that Viet Nam exported 800,000 tonnes of rice in October 2024, rising 29.1 percent year-on-year.
